Note: The ride starting points depend on the direction we are going:

NORTH: The QuikTrip at 2791 Dunn Rd., at New Halls Ferry and Dunn.

SOUTH: The McStop at Pevely (Exit 180 off I-55 at Z) OR the south end of the Dierbergs Mall on Hwy. 21, just south of I-270 (on the left hand or east side of 21 at the first light) OR by the Pink Elephant on Hwy. 141 and Schneider Rd., just north of Hwy. 21 (across the road from the Quick Trip at Hwy. 141 & Schneider, 2600 S old Hwy. 141).

WEST: The QuikTrip off I-70 (exit 222) by I-370 at Mid Rivers Mall (on the north side in St. Peters); or the BP just south of Hwy. 40 (I-64) on Long Rd.; or the QuikTrip in Eureka, just south of I-44 (exit 264) on 109.



Mileage Contest Results By Jeff Ackerman

The Gateway Rider's mileage contest runs for a year and includes all motorcycles ridden by the members during the year, not just BMWs. The contest nominally runs concurrently with the yearly points contest, namely from December through the following November. However, I accept mileage from members covering any year long period similar to this. This document gives the results for everyone responding by the end of December 2016. Twenty-one members provided ending mileage for this year; see the table below for complete results. Since this is my second year compiling the mileage, I was able to show the difference between 2015 and 2016 miles ridden for those members providing mileage both years. Eight participants rode more miles this year while ten rode fewer miles and I had no 2015 mileage for three. George Siede, with the "new" R75/5 he won at the rally, and Susan Anderson, with her new F700GS had the largest percentage increases in miles ridden. Traci Anderson, a new rider this year, rode 4426 miles, very good for a first year.

Your events director, Jeff Ackerman, came in first again this year by riding over 25,000 miles, ~5% more than last year. Fielding Childress moved up to second place from tenth place last year with his new GS Adventure. Jim Shaw moved up to third place from sixth last year. Phil Sulfstede fell to fourth place from second place because he spent much more time in New Orleans this year. Dave Anderson rounded out the top five, moving up from a tie for sixth last year.

Mary Ackerman was again the top placing female rider, coming in seventh this year vs. fifth last year. She rode about 3000 fewer miles this year but it was all due to just two trips. She rode fewer miles to the National this year (New England is much closer than the Canadian Rockies) and skipped the trip to the Smoky Mountains in October in favor of playing golf with the ladies in Biloxi.

There is still time to get into the contest for 2017. Just send me your beginning mileage for 2017 for each of your bikes and I will get you loaded into the spreadsheet. If you get a new or different bike this year, let me know the starting mileage and I will add it to the list. **GR**

2016 R1200RT-LC 12,000 Mile Service

I just completed the first 12,000 mile service on my R1200RT-LC in accordance with the Owners and Service manuals. The only part I skipped was to compress the brake calipers during fluid change because it would require a special BMW tool have yet to obtain or make myself. The fluids in the reservoirs were discolored but clear out of the calipers. I use Valvoline synthetic DOT4 in all my machines. Photo (1) shows Motion-Pro brake tool that incorporates a one-way check valve. It comes in 4 different sizes. I used an 8 mm unit for the front but had to use a regular 11mm wrench on the rear caliper.

The valve clearances were within specifications. If they weren't I would have to let the dealer perform that chore because of the special tools required. Photo (2) of the valves/cams with feeler gauge at rear inlet cam. Note the mark on the screwdriver used to denote top dead center. You may need new gaskets for the covers so plan on spending ~\$40 each. I used a little silicone seal on the old gaskets after some seepage occurred. So I have new gaskets on hand for next service.

I checked the spark plugs and they looked okay so I didn't replace them at this time. NGK plugs used are dual ground type and I found that O'Reilly has them available on special order. It took over a month for mine to arrive (\$10 each). The rear gear case uses 180 ml. of 75-90 synthetic gear oil.

I used K&N air and oil filters plus the Spectro oil I won at the RAMS's rally last year. I purchased the K&N air filter directly from K&N for \$50, and oil filters were special ordered from Walmart for \$10 each. Castrol 4T 5-40 synthetic at \$10/qt. can also be special ordered at O'Reilly. Promac tools (3) were used to remove the ignition module before the valve covers, and the front axle tool has both 19 & 22 mm sizes +3/8" driver. **GR**
